vocabam I was calling

 he (she, it) used to call
vocabamus we were calling
 we used to call
vocabatis you were calling
 you used to call
vocabant they were calling
 they used to call

Future Tense of Voco

vocabo I shall call
vocabis you will call
vocabit he (she, it) will call
vocabimus we shall call
vocabitis you will call
vocabunt they will call

Dative of Indirect Object:

Used with verbs and the like expressing giving, saying or showing indicating what was given, said or shown.

Dative of Reference:

Used to show to whose advantage of disadvantage and action is performed.

It often replaces for in English.
